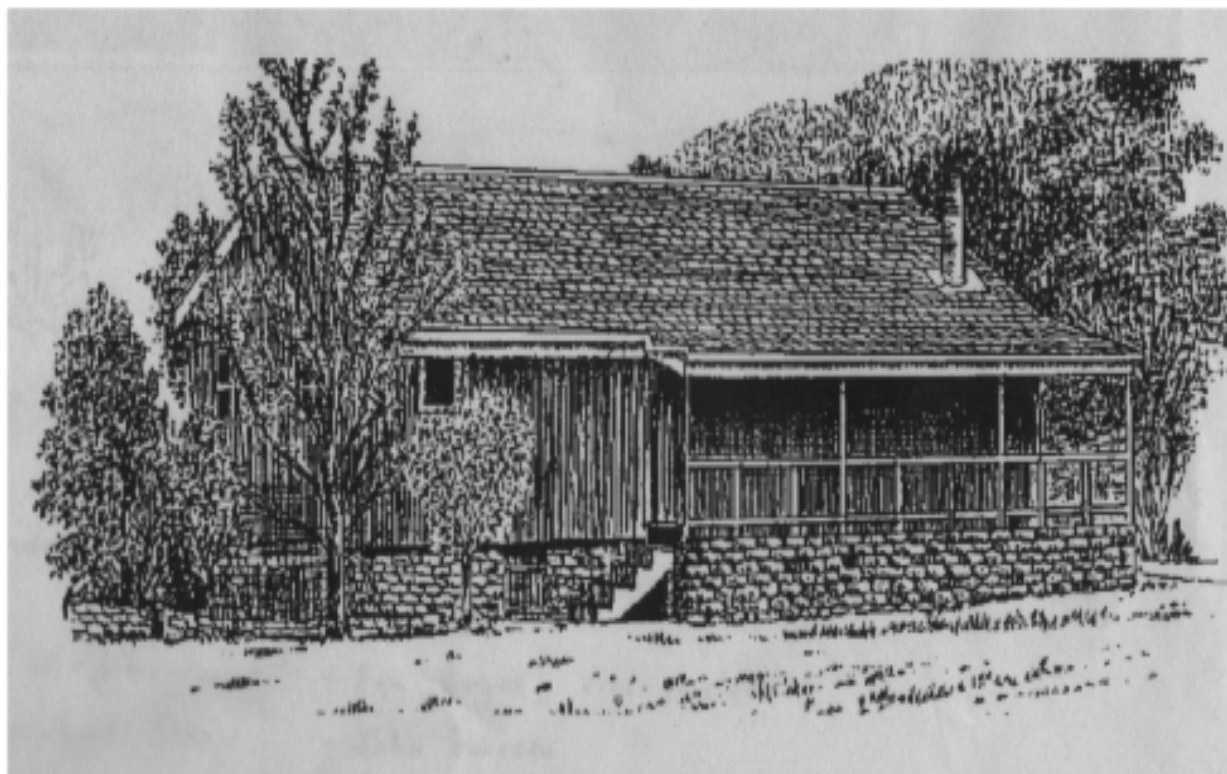

Basis of Trust The Trust was established as The Auckland Boys' Brigade Trust by deed dated 23 June 1983 to take over the assets and financial affairs of The Boys' Brigade Auckland Battalion Incorporated and of the other three unincorporated Auckland Battalions.

It became The Boys' Brigade Northern Regional Trust on 13 December 1989, widening its scope and sharing its resources by agreement with the other Battalions of the Brigade in the Region, from Taupo north.

Trustees are appointed by the Executive of The Boys' Brigade in New Zealand Inc. for two-year terms, as provided for in the deed. Trustees operate under the provisions of:

- the Trust Deed, 13 December 1989, amended 1 July 1992
- the Charitable Trusts Act 1957 and amendments
- the Charities Act 2005
- the Trustee Act 1956 and amendments

Trust objectives The Trust is charged with managing its assets "to further the ongoing work of the Brigade in the Northern Region" as detailed in the deed.

The Brigade itself exists to enhance the spiritual, mental, social and physical development of Boys and young men.

Trust powers The Trust's powers are also detailed in the deed. Among other actions, the Trust is empowered to:

- provide financial and property management services for the Northern Region including the soliciting for and the raising of further funds at the discretion of the Trustees.
- contribute towards development and outreach of the Brigade.
- contribute towards leadership training.
- make grants to Brigade and ICONZ units.

REVIEW OF THE YEAR 2018

The main activities of the Trust during the year were:

Meetings The Trust met twice during the year, in March and November. It also held telephone and email consultations to resolve issues at other times.

Trustee changes Trustees Ross McCarthy and Bruce Sai Louie resigned in March and April respectively and were thanked by Trustees for service they had given for so long. They were replaced by Andrew Cutler, who took over the Michael Stead Memorial Lodge portfolio, and Owen Goodwin, who agreed to manage the Communications portfolio.

Long-serving Trustee from Hamilton, Ward Fischer MNZM JP MNZIM MCILT suffered a relapse of the cancer from which he had been free for a number of years and died on 18 November. Several Trustees had served alongside Ward for over 40 years in different roles within The Boys' Brigade movement and counted him a close personal friend. He will be sorely missed on the Trust and in Hamilton where he was active in church and community. Ward bequeathed a generous donation to the Trust in his will.

Scholarship Details of the scholarship to recognise the long service of the Trust's late Treasurer, Bruce MacCarthy, were agreed on by Trustees: *"The Scholarship is aimed at providing a 'leg up' open to any eligible senior boy aged 17 + years (Year 13 or equivalent) or young adult leader up to 25 years meeting the selection criteria prevailing at that time so as to participate in an accredited or otherwise nationally recognised leadership/ personal development training programme."* Full information appears on the Trust's website bbnrt.org.nz.

Investments The Trustee Act 1955 requires Trustees to be prudent with Trust funds. In previous years, they used term deposits, spread between banks and the Presbyterian and Baptist Savings Societies. This saw income fall, even though above-average interest rates were obtained, but it protected the funds. Part of each year's income has been set aside in a separate Stedfast Fund in the accounts, to ensure funds do not lose value with inflation. Trustees are also moving towards having all funds with New Zealand owned organisations. Since late 2013, part of the funds has been placed with funds manager, Milford Asset Management, whose funds are spread over a wide range of entities, reducing risk, but giving a higher return than bank term deposits. In 2017 and again in 2018 the amount invested with Milford was increased. Milford provide information sessions for investors, which one Trustee attends.

Projects funded The major project continued to be employment and related costs of a Development Manager for The Boys' Brigade in New Zealand, to provide leadership stimulus, training and growth for its BB and ICONZ programmes for Boys and young men in the region in a fun, Christian environment. The number of new ICONZ units continued to grow. As well as helping churches to get units started and training new leaders, the Development Manager organised a number of successful, large-scale, fun events enjoyed by Boys and leaders from across the

Region. BBNZ, in collaboration with the Ministry of Education, has commenced an ICONZ Edge programme which is being used by several primary and intermediate schools and it is expanding.

The Trust subsidised the costs of 5 young men from the Region who attended the Brigade's National Leadership Development Courses.

Banking

Improved on-line and mobile phone banking services for voluntary agencies have made money management much easier for Trustees. One sets up and authorises payments, another logs in to co-authorise.

MSML

Michael Stead Memorial Lodge was opened in 1976 and named in honour of Michael Stead of the 2nd Auckland Company at Greenlane Presbyterian Church, who drowned in a canoeing accident on the Whanganui River. Michael's parents live in Northcote. (Bob Stead was a BB officer in Birkenhead when our Chairman was a Boy.)

Ross McCarthy maintained the Lodge for many years and upgraded and added to facilities. The Lodge, in beautiful natural surroundings, sleeps 24, has solar-powered lighting and hot water, and gas for cooking and refrigeration. A new 10-year lease of the Coromandel Forest Park site was signed in 2017 by DOC and the Trust.

During 2017, the Lodge continued to provide an activity base for a number of Brigade and other users but became inaccessible for



months after catastrophic flooding closed the road. The road was reopened mid-2018. The Lodge is advertised on the Trust's and BBNZ's websites. Bookings have increased but it is still under-utilised, so the Trust encourages more use by BB and ICONZ units and families. Lawn-mowing and security oversight is provided by the caretaker of the neighbouring Kauaeranga Valley Education Trust's lodge. Costs for this and for water rights are shared.

Nigel Hanlon Hut

This garage-sized hut at Piha has been used by BB companies since 1955 when it was built on land within the Auckland Centennial Memorial Park, now part of Auckland Council's Waitakeres parkland. It was later named after a Boy from the 56th Auckland Company at Northcote Baptist Church, killed in an accident.

During the years when the Trust owned Stedfast Park at Piha, use of the Hut became minimal and facilities deteriorated. After Stedfast Park was sold, the Trust renovated the Hut and provided new facilities. Graeme Johansen has Portfolio responsibility for it and Roly Stanley maintains it. A new lease was agreed with Auckland Council in 2015. Use of the Hut by BB, ICONZ and a range of other groups and families was increasing steadily but has had to be curtailed with closure of the area for camping after dangerous flash-flooding. Auckland Council is attempting to locate a safer venue so it can be re-opened.



Communications The Trust decided in 2017 to set up its own webpage bbnrt.org.nz as well as a link on the BBNZ site, advertising its purposes, activities and properties. We are very grateful to BBNZ for the link.

A supply of quality Trust-branded pens is purchased and issued to all leaders in the Northern Region each year. Trustees also give pens to individuals and groups to promote good-will and awareness.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

Accounting entities

The Trust is a single legal entity. It maintains the Michael Stead Memorial Lodge as a separate accounting entity for management purposes and it has a separate bank account. The Nigel Hanlon Hut operations are identified separately also for management purposes but it has no separate bank account and its surpluses are combined with the Trust's General Fund.

Milford Asset Management Private Portfolio

Because current value of the portfolio varies from day to day as a result of market fluctuations, the asset is valued at original contribution value only. The increase in market valuation at the end of the financial year is reported in a manner which reflects its uncertain realisable value even though the whole market value is at call. The portfolio is spread over a large number of investment instruments and funds, with each containing less than 5% of the Trust's investment. Balance date 2018 occurred at a bottom glitch in world markets. Total value recovered shortly after and 28 February 2019 valuation would reduce the year's loss to \$4453.

The Michael Stead Memorial Lodge income for 2017/8 was below previous years because a bad weather event caused damage to and closure of the sole Kauaeranga Valley access road and letting had to be suspended from mid 2017 to late 2018.

STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

There have been no changes of accounting policies during the year.

Depreciation

Buildings are depreciated on a straight-line basis. The Nigel Hanlon Hut is fully depreciated. Computer equipment is depreciated at 40% of diminished value

GST

The financial statements report all amounts exclusive of GST. To make the Trust's liability for GST (or refund due) at 31 December clearer on the Statement of Financial Position, it is aggregated into the Trust General column and not split between General and MSML.

Capital preservation

It is Trust policy to protect its investments by transferring funds to a capital preservation reserve referred to as the Stedfast Fund at a rate at least equal to the annual increase in the CPI. In 2018 CPI change annualised for the December quarter was 1.9%

TRUSTEES AND OFFICERS

Trustee, Chairman - Ian Bogue JP BA(Auck) BBS(Massey) DipTchg Retired 2010 as Head of Department, Commerce, at Mount Albert Grammar School after 38 years teaching and 8 years in the wholesale motor industry during the 1960s. He served in The Boys' Brigade at local level, as national Vice-President then Treasurer 1989-1997 and on national and regional executives and trusts. An elder at St Andrews Presbyterian Church Birkenhead. Justice of the Peace since 1990. Married with three daughters and four grandchildren, Ian and Robyn sail "The Ritz" in Gulf and coastal waters whenever possible.

Trustee, Secretary – Bevan Brown Registered Surveyor, with his own practice on Auckland's North Shore. Bevan was a long-serving BB Company Captain (14th Dunedin and 58th Auckland). He also served on Auckland, Regional and National Executives and held various camping and training roles. Bevan was a founding Elder of Forrest Hill Presbyterian Church and now attends Northcote Baptist Church. Bevan has two children and four grandchildren.

Trustee - Bruce Sai Louie PGDipIHM – A familiar face to most Brigade leaders throughout New Zealand, Bruce was for some years a Field Officer, National Development Officer then National Director of BBNZ, and filled a number of other roles including publications work and camp and event planning. A former member and Captain of the 2nd Auckland Company at Greenlane, Bruce is Retail Operations Manager at AUT University and lives in Mission Bay. Bruce holds the Grant Applications portfolio. (Resigned April)

Trustee - Ward Fischer MNZM JP MNZIM MCILT. Road Safety Consultant. Sailor. Author of numerous road safety books and publications and co-author of BBNZ's "Beyond 100 – A Development Plan". BB Officer since 1964. Former Founding Captain of two BB Companies. Past Vice-President BBNZ. Member of BBNZ National Executive for 13 years. Initiated extension and training work in parts of the Pacific. Author and Director of BBNZ's Stage Two National Leadership Development Courses for 20 years. President of BB Waikato. Holder of the Investments Policy portfolio. (Ward died in November and is sorely missed.)

Trustee - Graeme Johansen BArch ANZIA - Graeme is a Qantas Flight Attendant who also manages his own architectural practice. He was Chairman of the Auckland Boys' Choir for 10 years and is a member of St Andrews Epsom choir. Graeme has had long service as a Boys' Brigade Company Captain. He has served on the West Auckland and Northern Regional Executives and for some time chaired the Funding Committee of BBNZ. Graeme holds the Property portfolio - Nigel Hanlon Hut.

Trustee – Ross McCarthy Airline pilot with Qantas. Former Captain of the 32nd Auckland (Howick) Company, Ross has served on executives at regional and national levels. He has been active in training at NLDC courses for many years. Ross convened the Michael Stead Memorial Lodge committee for the Trust for a number of years before also becoming a Trustee with the Property portfolio - MSML. Ross is married with four children. (Resigned in March.)

Trustee – Andrew Cutler Previous BB member of 32nd Auckland (Howick) Company rising through the ranks to become a Queens Man in 1980. He returned as an Officer for a number of years and attended National Leadership Development Courses for several years as a Squad Officer/instructor. Andrew took over the running of the Michael Stead Memorial Lodge, helped by his wife Marie. Andrew and Marie have three teenage children and he is an Elder at Howick Presbyterian Church.

Trustee – Owen Goodwin JP. Previous BB member for many years, past Officer in the 18th Auckland Company, Birkenhead and active in Auckland and North Shore Battalions in various roles. Owen joined the Trust in 2019 and looks forward to developing more communication with BBNZ and the public.
